



MOVEMENT OF TROOPS AND MUNITIONS OF WAR.—COLLINS LINE DOCK, CANAL STREET, NEW YORK—OUTSIDE VIEW.

The above cut represents a fully-equipped United States regular battery of light artillery from some of the forts of the Eastern department embarking on transports, to proceed to the seat of war. The light batteries in the Union service consisted of six cannon, each drawn by six horses. A caisson, carrying ammunition, and also drawn by six horses, accompanied each piece. The movement of artillery forms a beautiful sight, but in the midst of peaceful scenes it is a terribly suggestive one.
