



ACCIDENT ON THE OHIO AND MISSISSIPPI RAILROAD, SEPTEMBER 17, 1861.—THE NINETEENTH ILLINOIS LOSING ONE HUNDRED MEN KILLED AND WOUNDED.

The above cut represents one of the disasters to which soldiers are exposed while in the line of duty, yet not strictly in action. Colonel Turchin's regiment, the Nineteenth Illinois, hurrying to the seat of war, lost in an instant as many men as would be shot down among the same number in a closely contested battle. Fortunately the pension laws recognize disabilities incurred in such manner as pensionable, if they are permanent.
