



RECAPTURE OF ARTILLERY, AT SHILOH CHURCH, NEAR PITTSBURGH LANDING, BY THE FIRST OHIO REGIMENT, GENERAL ROUSSEAU. MONDAY, APRIL 7, 1862.

The second day's fighting at Pittsburgh Landing retrieved the ill-success of the Union army on the first day, and forced the Confederates to relinquish all the ground and most of the spoils they had captured. Grant's army, which had made a successful stand near the Landing on the previous evening, was heavily reinforced by Buell and Wallace during the night, and early the next morning (April 7, 1863) Grant took the offensive, advancing his troops all along the line, retaking his lost ground and despoiled camps at Shiloh, recovering nearly all the artillery that had been lost and inflicting such losses upon the enemy—including their commander, General Albert Sydney Johnston—that they withdrew altogether to Corinth, Miss.
