There were 147 Union guns in position on the heights of Falmouth, but only 65 could be brought to bear upon the town of Fredericksburg. Colonel C. H. Tompkins' division, of 38 guns, did the greatest execution. They opened at 12.30 p. m., and continued firing until 2.30, at which time several buildings were burning.
